#### Question 1

Write your **letter**. You must include the following:

- what you agree with in the article
- which opinions you think were unfair **and** why
- details of the important local attraction that was not mentioned in the article.

Cover all three points above **in detail**. You should make your letter polite and informative. Start your letter 'Dear ...' and remember to supply a suitable ending.

#### Argument

- 3 'There are far more advantages to competing against others at a young age than disadvantages.' Do you agree? Give reasons and examples to support your view.
- 4 'Cities are a great place for young people to grow up in.' What do you think? Give reasons and examples to support your view.

#### Narrative

- 5 Write a story which includes the sentence: 'It was obvious that his aunt had not visited him just to say hello.'
- 6 Write a story in which a motorcycle plays an important part.
